Dear Parents, Guardians & Students,

As I pen down my thoughts for this edition of Espectro, I do it with a tremendous sense of relief and a sense of optimism for the future. Relief because we have just learnt that the new academic session can resume without the COIVD-19 restrictions, barring the usage of masks and maintaining hand hygiene. It means that school can once again resume with full strength after a gap of two years and that education can be imparted the way it was meant to be.

The past two years have been tough for all of us. But and I say it with a tremendous sense of satisfaction we have been able to tide through these testing times honourably. We managed to pay full salaries to our staff and no one lost their jobs due to the pandemic despite all sorts of financial concerns. I must also applaud my staff for working shoulder to shoulder with me in the best interests of the school. I also feel very satisfied to state that over the last two years, we did not raise fees for online classes and kept it at the 2019-20 levels with a further 20% concession. Over these two years, we have also renovated some parts of the school office and the canteen-along due project.

Despite online classes, we are happy to note that the learning loss has remained minimal. The proof of that is the performance of the students who have done wonderfully at the ICSE/ISC examinations. Not only

academics, but extra-curricular activities were also taken care of. Multiple events like Prize Day, Children's Day, Teachers' Day, Debates, Quizzes etc were held online. I hope the parents will appreciate the hard work of the teachers and the school management who have left no stone unturned to ensure that their wards progress despite the pandemic.

In the end, I wish all parents, guardians and students the best for the new academic year. May the future be safe and peaceful for all of us.

From the desk of **Officiating Principal**



Dear readers,

It is quite heartening to witness that life around us is coming back to normal and the schools are most likely to function with full strength from the forthcoming academic session. We had recently held brief but successful reorientation classes for all the students where

we tried to provide scope for acclimatization for the students who never had the opportunity to join physical classes for almost two years due to the pandemic. Now we are gearing up to welcome back the students to school but we can never let off our guard and always follow the COVID-19 protocols to ensure everyone's safety.

The 'learning from home' phase was quite a difficult time and it affected the students in many ways.

As we get ready to return to school it is important to plan the ways that will help to prepare for your return and deal with your worries. I would like to lay down these simple tips to be followed by the students which I consider very helpful to get them back on track.

Mental Preparation

Your Life has been quite different during the pandemic, so give yourself time to adjust back into routine and get it embedded into your mind that you are going back to school and that's the reality!

Discuss with your teachers and share your worries with them and with your classmates.

Get organized before the reopening day which is 11th April'2022. Check your school uniform and shoes beforehand as you might have overgrown the same and need to procure a new set.

Go through your timetable and syllabus which you will find on the school website. If you're unsure, ask your teacher or someone in your class. arrange your school bag and keep a face mask (N95) and hand sanitizer.

Get proper arrangements for attending school

punctually. Your school buses are the best option which will ensure your safe & timely travel. Talk with your family and friends to help you prepare yourself for returning to school.

Physical Health

Make sure you are having a healthy & balanced diet throughout the day and drinking enough water to keep yourself hydrated which will help you to concentrate, boost your energy level and support your general health.

Keep in mind that returning to school may make you physically and mentally tired for a while. You have to develop your stamina to remain energetic throughout the day at school. Try to spend some time doing some physical exercises to get the proper blood circulation and build up the strength required for the schooling time. You may take up walking, cycling, dancing, yoga, or any aerobics exercise. If you have changed your sleep cycle, then immediately revert to the old cycle whereby you used to attend physical classes before the pandemic. Make sure you get enough sleep to allow your brain to get rest. Get back into the routine of sleeping 8-10 hours so you can wake up in the morning in time for school. Avoid using your phone while going to bed. Read a book instead which will induce sound sleep.

Safety Precautions

Remain alert about the rules regarding mask-wearing at school and while traveling to and from school. Look at our website www.stfxonline.com or Facebook page or contact a teacher. Remember, COVID-19 protocols about physical distancing and hand washing are for the safety of everyone in the community.

Adhere to the changes to school-based activities like assemblies, PT, Break-time, and other activities to ensure safety for all.

I believe that with the cooperation of the parents, students, teachers, and all the stakeholders, we shall be able to bring back normalcy into our lives and gradually the painful memories of the pandemic will fade away.

Dear Readers. Greetings to all!

At the outset, I would like to congratulate the editorial team of Espectro for their effort in putting to print yet another edition of the newsletter.

School is the second home for the child and it is here that we nurture them to build responsible citizens who will lead the society and take the country forward. Education is what we learn that lives beyond the classroom. Therefore, we, at St. Francis Xavier School try our best to provide a child-centric, value-based learning environment. Our philosophy is to reflect the kaleidoscope of learning through various activities. Creating the right environment and keeping the students constantly engaged for positive outcome is challenging yet exciting and enriching. I welcome all the children back to school and wish that they can make up for their loss of those two years in the pandemic.


Special Assembly on Republic Day

Online Teachers' Training Programme



1. How long have you been associated with this institution?

2. Describe your first day experience in this school and how it has changed in these years?

Ans:- When I joined school, ISC practical exams were going on and classes were conducted for standard XI only. Just 40 kms away from Alipurduar, Chilapata is a dense forest near Jaldapara National Reserve. In its vicinity is 'Nalraja Garh', one of the oldest forts in India which is the main tourist attraction. Although in ruins and poorly maintained, it has great archaeological importance.

One can reach New Jalpaiguri by train or fly to Bagdogra. It is 73 km to Dooars by road. The meandering roads are a visual treat but definitely not for the weak hearted. The small tea stalls offer hot tea which refreshes tourists. On reaching Kodalbasti, one can check in at the State Government Resort. There are also numerous homestays which offer a homely experience.

After a restful night, one can leave for Chilapata Forest early morning. The sun rising in the east and a gentle breeze blowing, it is an ethereal feeling. On entering the forest, it seemed to come alive. The tall trees, the chirping and sighting of exotic birds seemed as if the Aranyani (the Goddess of forests) was inviting with her arms wide open. The sun rays playing hide and seek in the tall canopies, insects humming/churring, rustle of animals rooting in underbrush, wind whistling through the tree branches - indeed this was divine. Among the wildlife, onehorned rhino, large number of elephants, bison, deer, leopard, lesser cats, cheetah, sambar, barking deer, wild boar, etc, are available here.

The Nalraja Garh, or the fort of the Nal Kings stood with centuries of untold stories within it. One could imagine hearing the Emperor having a meeting with the courtiers or the Empress having a rendezvous at the royal garden. The fort now has the look of a haunted house and yet a beautiful piece of history to witness.

One can feel lost in this wilderness for centuries. It is like a dream turning into reality. A beautiful memory etched within the core of ones heart never to be erased with time. Chilapata forest indeed has everything to offer and it is no wonder that tourists haunt this place.

A special mention to Ashmit Palit, Ayush Sur and Aharnisha Sarkar who made it to the Finals.




